a European intellectual movement of the late 17th and 18th centuries emphasizing reason and individualism rather than tradition.



THE ENLIGHTENMENT:

It Changes the way that people in Europe view society, politics, government, and the economy.

The ideals that modern democracies are based on come arise during this time, like liberty and justice.



THE ENLIGHTENMENT:

These democratic ideas were promoted by Philosophes and changed the way that people thought about governments.

These ideas encouraged colonies to break away from their mother countries.

As always, the ideas of the Enlightenment took time to spread, and encountered resistance along the way.

ORIGINS OF THE ENLIGHTENMENT

Renaissance:

The rise of Humanism (the worth of the individual) and the revival of interest in the classics helped create the perfect environment for the Enlightenment.

ORIGINS OF THE ENLIGHTENMENT

Reformation:

The reformers questioned authority and encouraged people to think for themselves.

ORIGINS OF THE ENLIGHTENMENT

Scientific Revolution:

Encouraged people to draw conclusions based on logic, experiments, and observations. The Enlightenment Thinkers used similar methods.
